Martin Moore

WE WILL REMEMBER

We in Chapter 506 have lost another long time member and friend. Martin Moore passed away on April 11th at Rex Hospital in Raleigh.

Martin was born and lived most of his life in North Carolina. He joined the Army Air Force in his late teens, went to aircraft mechanics school and became crew chief for a group of T-6's. He had the opportunity to apply for flight school and officer training. After passing the required examinations, he was accepted and began a new adventure. Upon getting his wings, he was assigned to a B-24 squadron. The Army needed big strong young men to fly the B-24's.

He was assigned to the 455th bomber group in eastern Italy and flew thirty six missions over Germany, Austria and Romania. Some of the raids were very costly, losing great numbers of bombers. During one mission, in a lead bomber, his pilot was totally disabled approaching the target. Martin took command, completed the bombing run and flew his plane seven hours back to his base, landing airplane and crew safely. For his quick thinking, good judgment and flying ability he received the coveted Distinguished Flying Cross.

When Martin came home, he apprenticed as a baker and opened his own bakery. He liked to say he wanted a job where he could make lots of dough. Indeed, Martin made the "wedding cake" for the Moores fiftieth wedding anniversary and what a beautiful and delicious work of art it was.

It was my privilege to have Martin as a friend. We spent many hours together working on his Nesmeth Cougar (very similar to a Wittman Tailwind). During these pleasant hours, he related many war stories and experiences which fascinated me.

Unfortunately, Martin never got to see his airplane make its first flight.

Martin was a true southern gentleman and is survived by wife of sixty three years, Evelyn Baker Moore, two daughters Evelyn "Martie" McLeod and Patricia "Pattie" Moore, and a granddaughter, Kelly. He will be sadly missed by all who knew him.
